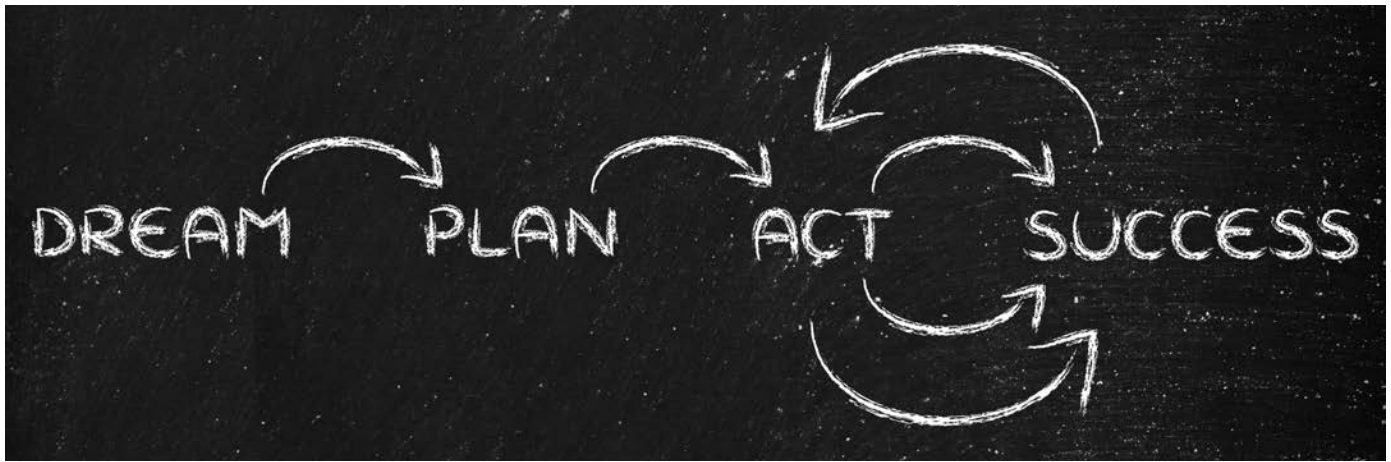

Copyright, trademark and contract law are complicated legal issues for musicians and bands to navigate. It is important to understand some of the basics to protect your music, your recordings, and your rights. Trademark law, for example, protects your band's name, while copyright law protects the music that you write and record. Contract law often limits your rights under copyright law. This course will offer you the opportunity to cover the basics of copyrights and trademarks; sole vs. joint ownership; licensing music from others; copyright and trademark laws; the importance of an agreement or contract between band members; key provisions to look for in recording and performance contracts; dealing with performing rights groups such as ASCAP; and how to find an attorney. After several years practicing in a law firm, Deb Quentel, Esq. spent three years as executive director of Chicago's Lawyers for the Creative Arts, a non-profit that provides free legal services to the Illinois arts community. There she conducted seminars on legal issues that impact musicians, filmmakers, and visual artists, and assisted arts organizations working to acquire not-for-profit and 501(c)(3) status. After LCA, she was a visiting assistant law professor at Chicago-Kent College of Law, where she taught courses in copyright, trademark and art law.

Frequently Asked Questions

When can I register for classes?

Registration for fall classes begins Monday, July 11. You can register for an available class up until the day it begins if it is not full.

Can I register for a class once it has started?

It depends on the class. Some instructors accept registrations during the first week of the class. Full tuition and fees will apply.

When and how do I pay for classes?

Payment is due at the time you register. Payment options include:

- Illinois Veterans Grant: Illinois Veterans Grant (IVG) students must be approved for tuition benefits prior to registering for Continuing Education classes. Students with IVG tuition benefits must register either by telephone 847.925.6300 or in person at Continuing Education Registration on campus. Any applicable class fees must be paid at the time of registration, but are not included in IVG benefits. To apply for or confirm IVG benefits, contact Harper's Veterans Specialist at 847.925.6000, ext. 2195.
- Alternative lenders: Harper Continuing Education DOES NOT accept Financial Aid acquired through the FAFSA, but does accept payment from alternative loan options for classes with tuition over \$1,000. Please contact us at 847.925.6000, ext. 2161 to discuss financial options.
- You may also wish to contact your own financial institution for alternative loan options. The federal code for Harper College is 003961.

What happens if my class is cancelled?

What is the age eligibility to register for Continuing Education classes?
